Dancing Otherwise Network: Exploring Pluriversal Practices (https://dancingotherwise.com/)

On the 24th and 25th of January 2024, the <u>Dancing Otherwise Network</u> hosted 'Mapping the Dance Pluriverse', a two-day online event.

The event invited keynote speakers from the fields of Social Activism, Philosophy and Ecology to consider the role of dance knowledge and practice within the fields and themes central to their research (social justice, thinking differently, human-nonhuman relations and ecological justice). Presenters from the fields of dance practice, choreography, producing, education and advocacy discussed their work and notions of pluriversality, connections across practices and regions and strategies for developing a more sustainable and interconnected dance ecology.
