Network Updates

Dancing Otherwise Network: Exploring Pluriversal Practices (https://dancingotherwise.com/)

On the 19th April the Dancing Otherwise network hosted the public event 'Dancing the Pluriverse – Dancing Otherwise'. The event comprised two workshops led by Anna de Clayes of Communitas dance and Charlie Ashwell, followed by a public round table discussion of the network themes delivered with the network's partner, South East Dance, Brighton. The network was joined by one participant, Lucy Clark, who is supported by a young dance maker's bursary - funded by the network and managed by another partner, the Sussex Dance Network.

Future Ecologies: Producing Dance Network (FE:PDN)

On the 18th April the FE:PDN hosted its second meeting for the Early Career Group. The meeting took the question 'what kind of mechanisms would make resisilent the eco-system(s) of dance?' as a starting point for its discussion.

On the 15th May 2024 FE:PDN hosted its third Early Career Group meeting. Discussion topics included 'How might producing dance be conceptualised as a form of academic research?' and other topics as suggested by participants.

The group's aim, at this time of unprecedented challenges, is to contribute to the future-proofing of dance as a profession and a discipline. The group is for all practitioners who self-identify as Early Career: this might be in all or any aspect of their work. Practioners invested in supporting Early Career dance professionals or initiatives are also welcomed.

The Early Career Group continues to meet regularly to discuss the future possibilities and challenges for dance.

South Asian Dance Equity (SADE): The Arts that British South Asian Dance Ignores Network

On the 29th and 30th April the SADE Network organised 'South Asian Dance and LGBTQi+ Identities'. The two-day event was hosted by Baithak, UK, and co-curated by Jaivant Patel Company.

On the 29th April Baithak, UK, hosted a public webinar with five artists/collectives: Nikhita Devi (UK), Komal Gandhar/DMSC (India), Raheem S. Payne (UK), Shiva Raichandani (UK) and Fazle Shairmahomed (The Netherlands). During the webinar contributors discussed how their work challenges the cisgenderism and/or heteronormativity that tends to dominate South Asian cultures, including dance. The provocations were followed by a Q&A with audience members. On the 30th April Baithak, UK, hosted an in-person event for an invited group of participants to further explore the themes set out in the webinar.
